## **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Nothing to eat or drink after midnight the night before the procedure. If you take heart medication or a blood pressure pill, you may take that the morning of your procedure will a little sip of water (before 7:30 am).
- 2. Do not take insulin/diabetic medication the evening before or the morning of the procedure.
- 3. **TRANSPORTATION REQUIRED**. A responsible family member or friend **MUST** drive you home from the procedure. You are NOT ALLOWED to drive, take a taxi, bus or car service, or leave the Surgical Center ALONE.

## \*<u>MEDICATIONS</u>\*PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE IF YOU ARE ON ANY OF THE FOLLOWING MEDICATIONS. DR. MALLAIAH WILL LET YOU KNOW WHEN TO STOP(IT CAN DIFFER FOR EACH PATIENT):

-Any <u>blood thinners</u> such as Coumadin(Warfarin), Plavix(Clopidogrel), Pradaxa(Dabigatran), Xarelto(Rivaroxaban), Eliquis(Apixaban), Brilinta(Ticagrelor), Effient(Prasugrel), etc. (sometimes may require clearance before stopping, we will let you know).

-PER DR. MALLAIAH STOP YOUR BLOOD THINNER \_\_\_\_\_DAY(S) PRIOR. -<u>Aspirin</u> and <u>Iron</u> may be stopped 3 days prior

-Any <u>Anti-inflammatory medications</u> including ibuprofen, motrin, aleve, naproxyn, naprosyn, meloxicam(mobic), sulindac(clinoril), piroxicam, feldene, indomethacin, diclofenac, aggrenox, ultram(tramadol) and voltaren. **Tylenol(acetaminophen)is safe to use**. **\*FOR THOSE WHO ARE DIABETIC\*:** 

-Do not take insulin/diabetic medication the evening before or the morning of the procedure. Please make sure to monitor your sugar throughout the day.

\*AGAIN, PLEASE call the office if you are on any of the above medications, we will let you know when to stop
